

\$5 Million in Legacy Grants Available

BUILD CAPACITY AND EMPOWER YOUR ORGANIZATION

We are seeking bold and innovative project ideas with the potential to have a practical and lasting effect on individuals, organizations, communities and/or broader systems.

The Law Foundation of Saskatchewan's 2025/26 *Legacy Grants Program* offers one-time grants of \$50,000 or more to non-profit organizations or registered charities. A total of five million dollars is available.

Eligible projects must have a legal education, legal research, legal aid, law libraries or law reform objective. All projects must benefit Saskatchewan residents primarily. Projects can span up to three years in duration. Legacy Grants are in addition to any existing grants from the Foundation.

Proposals for diverse types and sizes of projects are invited, whether they create everyday impact or transformational change. The Foundation will also consider capital projects and pilot applications that test and explore new concepts or approaches. However, there is no guarantee of ongoing funding.

The Foundation values projects that improve access to justice, have effective methods of measuring impact, and have in-kind and/or other sources of funding. Collaborations between organizations are welcomed.

If your project meets these requirements, please complete the Expression of Interest (EOI) form on the Law Foundation of Saskatchewan website: www.lawfoundation.sk.ca In the form, please provide a brief overview of the proposed project with enough detail to enable the Foundation to determine if the proposal will advance to the second stage of the application process. Applicants that do advance will be asked to complete a full application containing the particulars of the proposed project.
